



TORONTO - The Toronto Railway Museum will reopen starting on **Wednesday, July 1, 2020**. Our two, new guided tours will operate as well as the museum space in Stall 17 of the John Street Roundhouse. The Museum is located across the street from the CN Tower in the heart of Toronto's Entertainment District.

New for summer 2020! Two all-new guided tours will take small groups of visitors around Roundhouse Park and aboard our heritage train cars and railway buildings. Capacity is limited, and visitors must pre-book their tickets ahead of time.

The safety and well-being of visitors, volunteers, and museum staff are the highest priority. While the Museum is looking forward to welcoming visitors back, additional health and safety precautions are in place. Visitors are asked to stay home if they have any symptoms of COVID-19 or are considered to be in a high-risk category.

New directional signage installed in the museum will assist with visitor flow through exhibits, and hands-on and interactive exhibits have been temporarily removed. Guided tours will operate several times daily to accommodate smaller tour group sizes. Enhanced cleaning and disinfecting routines are in place for visitor health and safety during your visit.
