TORONTO - The Toronto Railway Museum and Master of Museum Studies candidates from the Faculty of Information at the University of Toronto present *Uncovering Union*, a new online exhibition. This virtual exhibit will go live on Monday, April 20.

Uncovering Union delves into nine different stories about Toronto's iconic train station. Visitors to the exhibit will travel back to the station's opening day in 1927, reminisce about Eaton's Santa Claus parade, discover life as a Red Cap Porter, and more.
