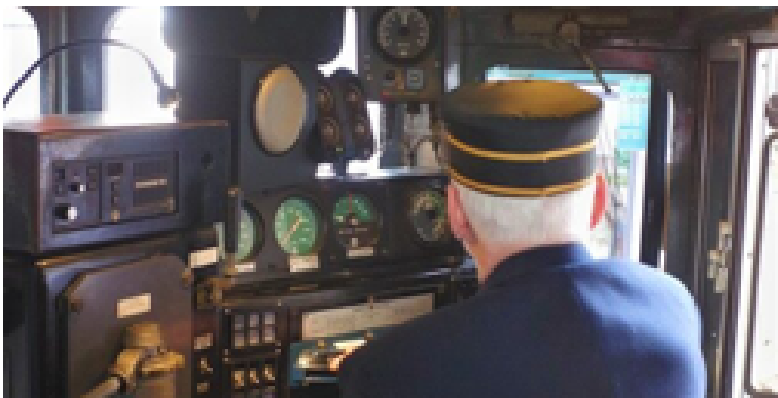

Toronto Railway Museum (TRM) is located in Roundhouse Park, across from the CN Tower, in the heart of downtown Toronto. We share the stories of Toronto's railway history. The Toronto Railway Museum is the repository of Toronto's vibrant railway history.

The City of Toronto is built on a backbone of rail lines. Over the past 150 years, these rail connections drove the City forward, propelling it from a sleepy provincial town into Canada's economic engine.

With one of the largest collections of Toronto-based artifacts in Ontario, including locomotives, rail cars, historical photos, and documents. The Toronto Railway Museum's most important goal is to preserve the legacy of rail in the City and tell its story- but the level of trains and tracks...but of the people who built them and kept them running.

TRAIN SIMULATOR

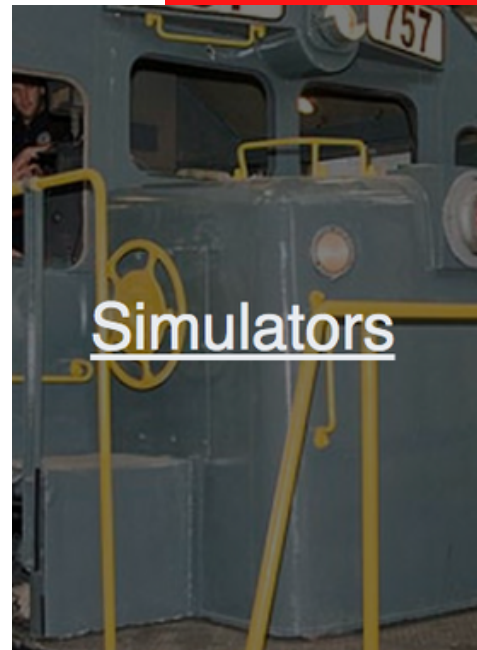


Our train simulator uses the program Trainz 2010, which is customized especially for the Toronto Railway Museum. Museum staff and volunteers built the simulator using real locomotive parts. Similarly, to build the course, our volunteers spent hundreds of hours building digital objects from scratch and incorporating them into the Trainz program.

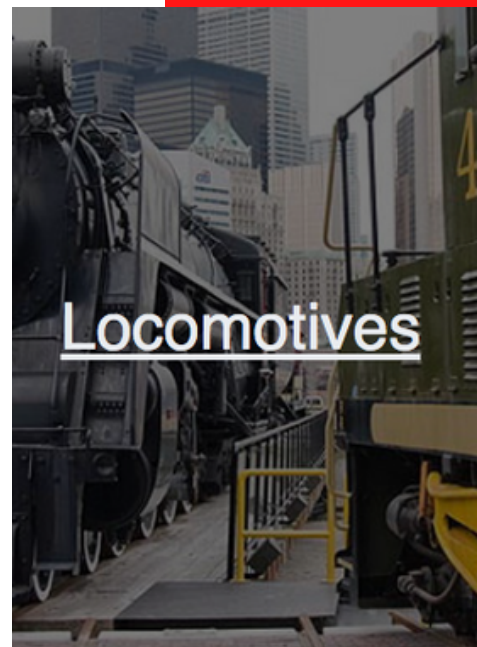

ROUNDHOUSE PARK MURALS



Roundhouse Park was created in 1997 on top of the southern expansion of the Metro Toronto Convention Centre. The park features the original, fully restored and operational 120-foot-long locomotive turntable and a carefully chosen collection of full-sized railway equipment.

On May 28, 2023 we unveiled four (4) new museum murals just in time for summer at TRM! Each of the four colourful art pieces illustrates Toronto's railway connections and were designed by Tori Berends.

MONUMENT TO CHINESE RAILROAD WORKERS WREATH-LAYING CEREMONY

2023 marks 100 years since the passing of the Chinese Exclusion Act in Canada. Join our friends from the Foundation to Commemorate the Chinese Railroad Workers in Canada on July 1 at the annual wreath-laying ceremony at the Chinese Railroad Workers Memorial.

Located at 4 Blue Jays Way, the Chinese Railroad Workers Memorial (5-minute walk from TRM).

GUIDED TOUR

Uncover the stories of Toronto's railways with a guided tour! The Toronto Railway Museum Roundhouse Park Tour explores how Toronto's railways shaped the social landscape of the city since their introduction in the early 1800s. How were Toronto's oldest communities impacted by the development of the railways? Further, what stories do our train cars tell? Join us to find out! Tours are in-depth, guided walking tours that take visitors around the museum grounds and aboard some of the rolling stock on display. Tour length is approximately 30 minutes.

Tour Schedule

Guided tours will be offered daily beginning on Thursday, June 15. Tours run at 12:30 pm, 2:00 pm, 3:00 pm, and 4:00 pm. Tours are included in the price of museum admission and visitors can register to join a tour upon arrival to the museum.
